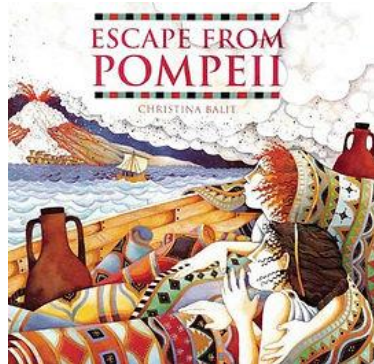

NC Objectives	KS2 - the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain
Unit of Work Summary	Children will learn the impact that the Romans had on Britain, including the building of Hadrian's Wall, Roman baths and Roman roads. Other key figures they will learn about include Boudicca and Aulus Plautius.
Prior Learning	Children will have learnt about the use of castle for attack/defence in KS1.

Sticky Knowledge

- To consider some of the reasons for which people leave their homes to live in another place.
- To define the terms 'invade' and 'settle', and start to think about how and when the Romans came to Britain.
- To place the Roman occupation on a timeline.
- To know that in 55 BC, Roman Emperor Julius Caesar attempted to invade Britain in order to increase his Empire.
- To know that the Celts were expecting this invasion and soon, the Roman's retracted back to Gallia.
- To know that Caesar tried again in 54 BC, this time successfully taking over parts of the south east of Britain.
- In 43 AD, the new Emperor, Claudius, was determined to invade more of Britain, resulting in 40 years of fighting between the Celts and the Romans.
- In 60 AD, Queen Boudicca tried in vain to defeat the Romans but they were too powerful in their force.
- Later, Emperor Hadrian, determined to protect his territory in the north of Britain, ordered a 117km wall to be built with castles, forts, barracks and eventually, whole communities to protect it.
- To know that Along with their fighting spirit, the Romans also brought with them their impressive construction skills, building beautiful Roman baths, developing hypocaust heating systems and building miles upon miles of straight Roman roads.
- To know that the Romans began invading Britain in 55 AD.
- To know that Julius Caesar ordered the invasion of Britain.
- To know that the Romans were not successful when they first invaded Britain but were successful when they returned in 54 AD.
- To know that Boudicca was the Queen of the Iceni tribe.
- To know that the Iceni tribe fought and destroyed parts of Colchester, London and St Albans.

	• To know that the Roman Emperor, Hadrian, ordered a wall to be built to separate and protect the Romans from the Caledonia tribes. • To know that Hadrian's Wall is 117.5km long, 6m high and 3m wide. • To know that there are many castles, forts and barracks along the length of the wall to help patrol and guard it. • To know that Romans built many elaborate baths in Britain where they would go to relax, exercise and socialise. • To know that Romans built new and improved roads in Britain to help transport troops and supplies easier. • To know that in early Roman times, the Roman people believed in many different gods and goddesses whom they believed controlled different aspects of their lives such as times, love and the seas.
