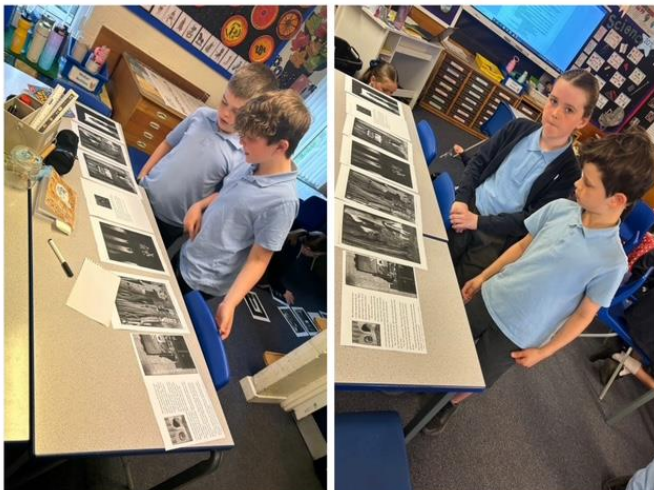


Y2 Geography



Year 5

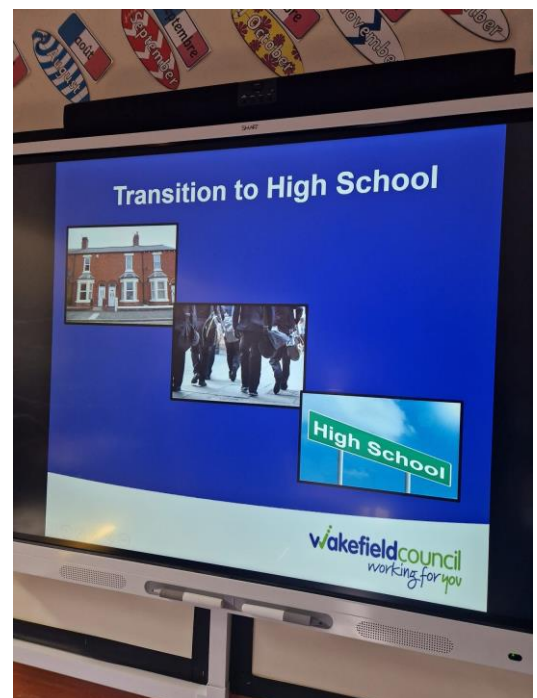
